Did you know that our humanitarian services cover an infinite variety of items among which are: food to the hungry; shelter for the homeless; clothing and fuel for the needy; milk for the under-nourished babies; outings for underprivileged children; artificial limbs for the maimed; hospital beds; rehabilitation of crippled children boys and girls camps, training for the blind and many others of equal worthiness. The nice thing about all this humanitarian work we have and can provide is there is little or no red tape involved. Have you every had that warm feeling you get when you ring a door bell and see 4 or 5 little faces staring up at you as you hand them a box of food for Christmas or Thanksgiving and a mother and father overwhelm by our generosity and saying thank you over and over again. 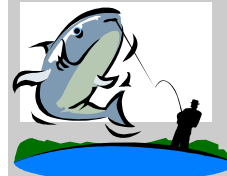
