Trust me, the officers, and trustees can not do this alone we need every member's help and effort to get our membership numbers back on track.

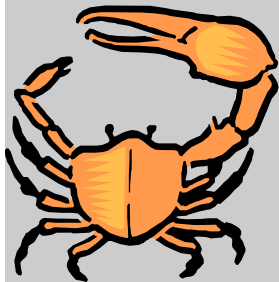
